OUR SCHOOL

Arlington High School is a four-year comprehensive school with an enrollment of 2900 students with recent graduating classes averaging 700 students. AHS is accredited by the NY State Education Department. We continue our long tradition of academic excellence. With over 213 course offerings, students experience an extensive and challenging range of studies to develop the necessary skills needed for college, the workplace and life. All classes meet at least 225 minutes/week and lab sciences meet approximately 360 minutes/week. AHS offers approximately 70 extracurricular activities.

OUR COMMUNITY

The District is located 75 miles north of New York City and is comprised of two primary schools (K-2), two intermediate schools (3-5), 4 elementary schools (K-5) two middle schools (6-8), and one high school (9-12). It covers 114 square miles and is situated to the east of both the Hudson River and the City of Poughkeepsie. The majority of students are from middle class families in towns, villages, and rural areas. The area has IBM manufacturing and research facilities that are staffed with highly trained technicians, engineers, and scientists. Local colleges include: Bard, The Culinary Institute of America, Dutchess Community College, Marist, Mount St. Mary's College, SUNY New Paltz, West Point Military Academy, and Vassar College.

OUR ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Arlington High School Aqua Pals won the National Lexus challenge under the direction of Mrs. Tricia Muraco
- Arlington English teacher Julie Jee was chosen for the Heinemann Fellows Award
- The Business Education Department partnered with the University of Chicago in the development and testing of their Financial Education Initiative curriculum for high schools across the country
- Arlington Admiral Marching Band was named the 2016, 2017, and 2018 National Class NYSFBC State Champions
- Arlington School District was honored with the Best Communities for Music Education designation from the NAMM Foundation in March of 2018 for its outstanding commitment to music education. Arlington is one of 4% of districts across the nation receiving the prestigious award in 2019 and has received this designation every year since 2012
- Students selected from English classes at Arlington High School consistently place in the final round of the Literacy Connections Spelling Bee held each March at Marist College
- One student received a gold medal (95th percentile), two received silver (85th-90th percentile) and two received bronze (75th-80th percentile), as well as 13 honorable mentions for their performance on the National French Exam
- Two students received a gold medal (95th percentile), two received silver (85th-90th percentile) and two received bronze (75th-80th percentile) for their performance on the National Italian Exam
- Over two hundred Arlington Art students participated in the Scholastic Art and Writing Awards. Our students won several Gold and Silver Keys, along with numerous honorable mentions
- 30 Varsity and Junior Varsity teams at Arlington High School were recognized as Scholar Athletic Teams
- Boys Cross Country Team, Boys Indoor and Outdoor track team, Girls Soccer Team, Boys Track all won Section Championships
- Boys and Girls Indoor Track, Boys and Girls Spring Track, Boys Basketball, Boys Cross Country, Girls Soccer, Girls Basketball, Boys Tennis, Boys Golf all won League Champions.

REPORT CARDS

A numerical system is used with a range from 0 to 100. The minimum passing grade is 65%.

Report cards are issued four times during the year. The grade shown at the end of each report period is the student's grade for that marking period only and is a reflection of both class work and tests.

The final course average entered on the final transcript is the combination of the class average (4/5) and the final examination (1/5). The transcript shows the final examination grade, the Regents examination grade, if applicable, and the final course average in each course.

The GPA is used to determine class rank. Each course is assigned a factor, which is listed with the course title. The GPA is determined by the formula:
