A Message From Nurse Carrigan

Students must be free from fever, vomiting, and/or diarrhea for 24 hours WITHOUT medication before coming to school. We understand completely how having a sick child disrupts schedules, but sending them to school is not fair to our classmates and staff.

<u>Screenings</u>: Kindergarten is currently undergoing screenings for eyes and ears. Please pay close attention to referral paperwork that has been sent home, if it was determined that a referral was needed.

<u>Physicals</u>: If you have received a ParentSquare message stating we need a physical for your student, please send it in ASAP! **Doctor's Offices DO NOT automatically send physicals to schools**.

NYS requires physical for K, 1, 3, & 5. If you have not done so already please send in a copy of your student's physical or have your pediatrician's office fax it to me at (845) 350-4165.

A Message From Nurse Carrigan, con't.

Absent Notifications are sent automatically by the district. They are sent even if you have made us aware of the absence. If you believe the absence is a mistake please reach out to Mrs. Shaw in the Main Office at tshaw@acsdny.org.

Please note that the Health Office does NOT act as an Urgent Care.

Therefore, you should not send a symptomatic student to school to be assessed by the nurse.


