Kindergarten worked on retelling the story, 3 Billy Goats Gruff and used STEM skills to build a bridge for the goats to climb on!












First graders were learning about maps and their own special place in our world!



# A Message From Nurse Carrigan

Please make sure your student is dressed weather permitting and appropriately for school. The Lost and Found is full of winter jackets and sweatshirts. Anything not claimed will be donated.

- Screenings: Screenings will continue throughout this month. Families of students who failed a screening and required a referral will be notified and paperwork sent home.
- Physicals: Letters have been sent home with students of those who still require a physical, notifying families IF a physical is not sent, their student will be scheduled to have a physical with the district's doctor.

Doctor's Offices DO NOT automatically send physicals to schools.
NYS requires a physical for K, 1, 3, & 5. If you have not done so already please send in a copy of your student's physical or have your pediatrician's office fax it to me at (845) 350-4165.

Please note that the Health Office does NOT act as an Urgent Care. Therefore, you should not send a symptomatic student to school to be assessed by the nurse.


## A Message From Nurse Carrigan, con't.

Allergy season is upon us! If your student suffers from seasonal allergies, it is time to start their DAILY medication. These medications will only work to their full potential when given daily! Missing a dose can make your day miserable, which in turn affects your ability to focus and be productive. With that being said, please be aware of your students' symptoms. If you notice they are experiencing a flare up of symptoms and are having an extra hard time, regardless of if they have taken medication they may need a day of rest. If a student comes to the health office with extreme allergy symptoms you may be called to pick your student up.

#### Ways to alleviate allergy symptoms:

- Over the counter or prescribed allergy medication
- Cold compress to eyes and face (don't rub)
- Cool water on face
- Stay hydrated with water
- Hot tea to relieve congestion and sinus pressure

- Air purifiers and air conditioners
- Shower daily
- Change clothes daily
- Consult with your doctor


#### **Staff and Teacher Appreciation Week** is coming May 12th to 16th.
