To join the ASM Google Classroom, you must login as your child. Your child's login credentials which can be found on Parent Portal under eye color (username) and hair color (password).

ASM Google Classroom code: jlvqlsq

Cell phones are not permitted on the school bus or in school. If your child must carry a cell phone for before school and after school safety reasons, a note must be sent to Ms. Todd. If cell phone permission is granted, the cell phone must remain off while on the bus and in school. No exceptions.

Absent Notes~

The state requires an absent note for any and ALL absence. The note must include students name,
dates absent, & reason for absence.

Physicals ~

• NYS requires New students & students in grades K, 1, 3, & 5 to have current physicals on file. Please send in your students physical.

Medications are NOT to be transported to or from school by students! This is NYS LAW and a huge safety concern.

A Message From Nurse Carrigan

Unfortunately it is inevitable that our students will get sick, especially as we head into FLU & cold season. Do YOUR part in helping minimize the spread by not sending your child(ren) to school sick.

If your child tests Positive for COVID, Contact the Health Office immediately.

- A positive case of COVID requires students to be 24 hours free from fever, vomiting, and/or diarrhea without medication prior to returning to school. It is strongly suggested to return to school wearing a mask
- With ANY illness, symptoms must be significantly improved or resolved before your child is able to return to school.
- All students must be 24 hours free from fever, vomiting, and/or diarrhea without medication prior to returning to school!
- If a student arrives to school stating they vomited that morning or the night prior, a call will be made home to inquire.



P.T.A. Information





The District Equity Team is hosting "Access Arlington" at Arlington High School on Saturday, September 28th Ipm-3pm. The purpose of this event is to help our families understand the services and communication structures within the Arlington Central School District they will need in order to best support their child.

Attendees can attend two of the following sessions:

UNDERSTANDING THE DIGNITY FOR ALL STUDENTS ACT (DASA)

Receive information/clarification about what the DASA law states, how it protects and supports students, staff, and families, and what is covered under the law. We will also discuss the process of initiating a DASA report, and what your rights as parents are under the law.

COMMUNICATING WITH THE DISTRICT - WHO AND HOW?
