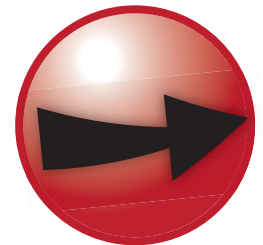
This \$36.8 million project will cost each household between \$6 and \$14 per year*. The project is eligible for \$24.6 million in state aid.

Frequently Asked Questions About the BOCES Capital Project

1. What is this I hear about a Dutchess BOCES Capital Project?

In December, Dutchess BOCES will seek approval in a county-wide referendum for a capital project to renovate and expand buildings on the Salt Point Campus.

The project, when completed, will:

- ♦ eliminate the need to lease property for the Alternative High School (after more than 25 years)
- ♦ create flexible, modern spaces for all the Dutchess County students served at the site
- ♦ improve security and respond to substandard facilities

2. What is included in the Project?

The \$36.8M project will address needed infrastructure improvements that have deteriorated over more than 50 years without a major capital project.

The project will include:

- ♦ new and renovated classroom and lab space
- ♦ a reconfiguration of the campus to improve safety and security for students and staff
- ♦ a conference center for staff training and community use
- ♦ space to meet the growing needs of Dutchess County students

3. Why is this project needed?

This project is needed to:

- ♦ fulfill BOCES' mission to educate and prepare skilled workers for Dutchess County
- ♦ to ameliorate infrastructure deficiencies over the last 50 years
- ♦ to eliminate rental costs for the Alternative High School

4. How is it funded?

The project is funded proportionately by school districts based on their district enrollment. Because the project is spread over all the residents in the county and comes with a measure of State aid, the impact is relatively small—between \$6 and \$14 annually for residents with homes valued at \$275K. In the end, the investment will pay for itself by eliminating escalating rental costs and cost avoidance at the rental location.
