Which levels of languages are offered in Arlington?

Checkpoint A Checkpoint B Checkpoint C

In the Level 1/ Checkpoint A courses offered at UVMS, LMS and AHS, students will learn how to communicate at a novice low to novice mid level and develop an understanding and appreciation for the various cultures of the world.

Checkpoint B is split over 2 years between level 2 and level 3. In level 2, students will gain proficiency and learn to communicate at a novice high to intermediate low level. In level 3, students will continue increasing proficiency to begin to communicate at an intermediate mid level. At both levels students expand their knowledge and understanding of world cultures.

Checkpoint C is split over 2 years between level 4 and level 5*

In levels 4 and 5, students will be able to communicate at an intermediate mid to intermediate high level or proficiency and are equivalent to intermediate college level courses. Knowledge and understanding of world cultures expands and deepens at each level.

* College credit is available through DCC and/ or the AP exam.

Reaching Proficiency & Advanced Regents Diploma Designation



- At the end of Level 1, students will take the NYSAWLA Checkpoint A Proficiency Examination. Students that pass both the course (1B in the middle schools and level 1 at the high school) and the exam will earn their 1 credit required for a traditional Regents diploma in NY State.
- Students that complete levels 2 & 3 in French, Italian or Spanish and pass the NYSAWLA Checkpoint B Comprehensive Examination will earn credit towards the Advanced Regents Diploma.**
- Level 5 courses in French, Italian or Spanish offer DCC concurrent enrollment. Students can potentially earn up to 6 college credits and/ or 3 AP College Board credits by the end of level 5.

**The Advanced Regents Diploma also has other requirements. Please consult with your child's guidance counselor to ensure that your student is on pace for this graduation designation.

World Languages: Extra curriculars

Each world language program offers students the opportunity to join a club for additional opportunities to experience and promote each language and culture.

Each world language program has a national honor society chapter at AHS. Students who meet the academic criteria will receive an invitation to apply to become a member of the AATF / AATI / AATS chapter of AHS and be inducted in the spring.

Each world language program offers trips to countries where the student will have the opportunity to experience and be immersed in target language and culture in real life. These trips usually run every other year and are an amazing experience for all to make lifelong memories.




