Meet the Ozobot!

This adorable little robot will do what you command - as long as you get the code right, using broad-tip markers.

Some of the Commands for the Ozobot:



- Go Fast/ Slow
- Pause for three seconds

Make a U-turn

research projects on Frida Kahlo and Cesar Chavez,



learned all about copyright this month, after reading Earmuffs for Everyone by Meghan



are performing basic keyword searches and learning how to find information about a book from title pages, informational pages and a book's record online.




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


The Dark by Lemony Snicket
