Week of December 11 - 15, 2017

Reading

This week's reading lessons focused on:

- thinking more deeply about fiction texts to determine what LESSONS an author wants US to learn
- writing a brief RETELL of what we read during independent reading (fiction) OR writing a few learned facts using our own words (nonfiction)
- having "book talks" with our reading partners at the end of independent reading
- learning about NONFICTION TEXT FEATURES as we cut apart a RAZ Kids book to make a reference book of examples for ourselves. We've learned about the following features:

- title
- table of contents
- photographs
- captions
- headings
- bold print words

Math

This week's math lessons focused on:

- skip counting by 2s, 5s, and 10s (beginning with numbers like 15 or 17)
- writing and identifying ORDINAL NUMBERS (1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th...)
- building and writing 3-digit numbers with place value blocks
- reading and writing NUMBER WORDS for numbers up to 100
- mental math problem solving as we moved numbered marbles from 3 jars to make each of the jars equal the same sum

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Writing

This week's writing lessons focused on:

- writing pages for our collection books that have a topic sentence, details, and a closing sentence (paragraphs!)
- using nonfiction text features in our books (Table of Contents, Headings, Labels, Captions, Glossary)
- sounding like an expert - using our teacher voice in our writing
- making a nice PRESENTATION of our books so readers WANT to read our books!
- writing a CONCLUSION to wrap up our nonfiction books
- adding a GLOSSARY to explain unfamiliar words to our readers (as well as practice using a dictionary!)
- planned out and began a second nonfiction book on a topic that we are EXPERTS on ☺

Our spelling/phonics lessons focused on:

- long o patterns (o-e, oa) and short o
- silent letters (knock)
- r-controlled vowels (ar, er, ir, or, ur) and learning the r changes the short a sound
- making words in the mystery word
