#### <u>Reading</u>

This week's reading lessons included: - paying attention to HOW authors get us to REACT to their stories (what makes a story happy, sad, surprising, etc.) - reading fluently and expressively - talking about books and our reactions to them with a reading partner - retelling books we have listened to or

read using sentence starters such as:

"In the beginning...."

"First...." "Then...."

"In the middle..."

"Next..." "After that...."

"At the end..."

"Finally...."

- thinking about the LESSON the author wants US to learn through the characters in their story

Our Math lessons have focused on: - making a fun Pizza Fractions project with questions for other students in the school to answer


reviewing skip counting by 5s and 2s
through our "Pop" game that we enjoy so

(We spend time skip counting as readiness for multiplication and division in third grade!)

introducing place value work as we build
2-digit numbers with tens and ones blocks
and draw tens and ones blocks to
represent 2-digit numbers

 end the week counting up our money (using our skip counting skills!) and visiting the classroom store <sup>(3)</sup>

# <u>Writing</u>

In Writing, we have focused on:

- writing our own fiction stories as we create a version of <u>The Mitten</u> to display in our door decorating contest! I was impressed with the creativity the kids showed!

- trying to add dialogue and action to our pieces to make them more interesting for our readers!

- exploring our COLLECTIONS and beginning an Expert Writing Piece (nonfiction) about them

- So far, we have created:
  - a cover page that grabs the reader's interest
  - a TABLE OF CONTENTS that shows the reader what they will learn in our books
- an INTRODUCTION that introduces our topics and what we will teach

\*\* Nonfiction books look and sound very different from personal narratives and fiction!
