The New York State Math curriculum is demanding. All students in the **Algebra 1A** course are required to take a course *Final Exam* at the culmination of the course in June. Arlington High School provides a 182 day program for you to succeed. It is essential that you attend, and be prepared each day for class.

Homework:

Homework will be given four to five nights a week. There is usually NO homework on test days. Homework should take approximately 20 minutes to complete. Homework will be in the form of written work, calculations, graphing, reading, or a project.

Quizzes and **Tests** can be expected any day during the school week. At least one day notice will be given for a quiz. At least three days notice will be given for a test. NO EXTRA-CREDIT WILL BE GIVEN, although bonus questions will be given occasionally on quizzes and tests.

Students will be graded on total points per quarter. For example:

Assessment	Points obtained by	Total Points
	Student	
Test 1	80	100
Test 2	85	100
Homework	85	100
Quizzes	110	125
Totals	360	425

To find average add your points together and divide by the total points, from the above example:

Points obtained by student
$$\times$$
 100 = $\frac{360}{425}$ \times 100 = 84.7%

In this example, the student would receive an 85% for the quarter grade.

If you are absent the day before a test you will be expected to take the test. (Since you have homework each day, your books should be home, and you were notified of the test in advance.) If a student is absent on the day of a quiz or test, the day the student comes back to school, he/she has 1 day to make up the quiz or test. If it is not made up it will result in a zero grade.



Rules and Regulations:

I expect all students to follow all the rules and regulations stated in the **Arlington Student Handbook** and the following **classroom rules**:

- □ Be in your seat, ready to begin work, when the bell rings.
- □ Always bring necessary materials to class.
- □ Work from beginning to end of the period.
