- 8) <u>Board President's</u> Mrs. Lappan congratulated Board Member, Peter Bodnar, on the birth of his son. She also congratulated Dr. Eraca for her recent accomplishment of receiving her doctoral degree.
- 9) <u>Superintendent's</u> <u>Remarks</u>
 Dr. Lyons congratulated Mrs. Pregnall's science class for being the winners of the Lexus Ecco Challenge. The grand prize is \$30,000.00. This is the second time that her class has won the grand prize. Dr. Lyons also acknowledged that the District was recognized as being the best community for music education. And lastly, he announced that the high school production, 42nd Street, will be performed on April 17, April 18, and April 19. Tickets are available for purchase.

10) <u>Reports and Board</u> <u>Discussion Items</u>

Arlington High School Student Government Report

The students gave a brief overview of the past and future events at the high school. Some of these included the Prisms event on February 18 and 19 which highlighted the musical students and the Senior Folies on February 26 which was very well attended. The Pasta and Dessert Challenge was held on February 12 and the Student Government trip took place on March 11. The Hockey and Track teams did very well this season and the spring sports are underway. The Teacher Untalented Show is scheduled for April 28 at 6:00 pm. The Junior Prom is scheduled for May 20. Graduation is scheduled for June 25 at 2:00 pm.

<u>Overlook Primary School Professional Learning Communities Report –</u> <u>Margaret Maraia</u>

Mrs. Maraia reviewed the PLC work in the literacy area. She stated that the aspirational goals are that 100% of students reach grade level by June 16, 2016. The reality is as follows: Kindergarten – 69%, 1st Grade – 67%, 2nd Grade – 65%. Mrs. Maraia spoke of ways that the teams are improving those scores. Reading instruction, conferencing and school connection are a few ways that they plan to achieve their goals. Mrs. Maraia stated that PLC not only stands for Professional Learning Communities, it also stands for Positive Literacy Celebrations. She also talked about how music affects all areas of learning and how music inspires everyone. She shared a video of the students engaged in learning and how music is playing a very important role in their education. Mrs. Maraia thanked the Board for their support throughout the years and that it has been an honor to work for the Arlington School District. Mrs. Lappan stated that she will be missed and Dr. Lyons thanked her for all her years of dedication.

Smart Schools Bond Act Overview - Jo Ann Kraus

Mrs. Kraus gave a presentation on the Smart Schools Bond Act. She stated that Arlington Central School District is eligible to receive \$5.2 million dollars. In order to receive this bond the school district has to apply. There is no deadline to apply. The focus will be on "school connectivity" and "high tech security features." She reviewed the vision and the scope of the proposal as well as the process.

<u>School Start Time Report – Dr. Brendan Lyons</u>

Dr. Lyons reviewed the actions to date. In March, 2015, Mr. Brown presented to the Board the findings of the committee and the research base for making such a change. At that time the Board asked for further exploration of changing start times. Dr. Lyons reviewed the following areas: total hours of sleep, biological phase delay and altered sleep drive in adolescence, and the effects of adolescent sleep loss. He reviewed the potential positives and negatives as well as the financial implications. Dr. Lyons stated that at this time the recommendation is to make no changes to the District's start time.

d) Sale of Raymond Avenue Property

BE IT RESOLVED, WHEREAS, the Arlington Central School District (ACSD) has closed and vacated the former Arthur S. May Elementary School Building at 25 Raymond Avenue, Poughkeepsie, New York, and there is no foreseeable future use for this property for school district purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education, as fiduciaries of the ACSD with the obligation to obtain the highest price for the property in the best interest of the School District, has conducted a sealed bid process for the sale/lease of this property, and has received several offers for the purchase of the property with improvements; and

WHEREAS, the highest bidder was awarded the sale, but has terminated its offer; and

WHEREAS, upon review of all of the offers, the Board of Education has determined that it is in the best interest of the School District to sell such building and property to Paz Management, Inc., the party presenting the second highest offer to purchase;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the ACSD declares the property located at 25 Raymond Avenue, Poughkeepsie, New York as surplus and of no further use to the School District, authorizes its sale, and accepts the offer of \$2,100,000.00 from the purchaser Paz Management, Inc.; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Assistant Superintendent for Business is authorized to send Paz Management, Inc. notification of the acceptance of its offer under terms and conditions established through the sealed bid process and expressed in the document "Paz Management, Inc. Request to Consider Offer," and that the Superintendent is authorized to

execute a Contract of Sale with Paz Management, Inc., upon approval of same by the School Attorney.
