# 7) Superintendent/ Board President Report

Dr. Lyons introduced Mrs. Kathleen Lowell, Principal of Beekman Elementary School. Mrs. Lowell's presentation highlighted how Common Core is integrated with ELA and math in the special areas, i.e. music, physical education, art and library. One example given was using math to convert steps into miles.

The District Clerk reported the upcoming events for June, 2014.

Dr. Lyons reminded everyone that the Memorial Day Remembrance event will take place on June 1<sup>st</sup> at 3:00 pm to honor our veterans. The event will be held at Arlington High School.

Mr. Benante followed up on the Board resolution regarding state and local assessments. The Board approved the resolution at the March 24, 2014 business meeting. Mr. Benante spoke about an excerpt from the resolution "Our curriculum will never support 'teaching to the test' at the expense of students' continuing classroom educational experience." He reviewed guidance to teachers, test preparation, and the article entitled, "Beyond the Five-Paragraph Essay."

Ms. Zimmerman gave a presentation on school resource officers. She reviewed the role of the school resource officer, prevention and the first line of defense. She also reviewed the building coverage and how the school resource officers' presence has enhanced the school environment. Mrs. Roberto, Arlington High School House Principal, spoke about the positive rapport the officer has with the students. He provides counseling in a proactive way. Mr. Dan Shornstein spoke on behalf of school resource officers in elementary and middle school buildings. He stated the officers are supportive of the students and what a wonderful asset they are to all the buildings.

Mr. Steven Tinkelman, Tinkleman Bros. Development Corporation reported to the Board on the Van Wagner/Springside Tax Pilot Presentation. Mr. Todd Tancredi, Poughkeepsie Town Supervisor, and Mr. Eric Hollman, Poughkeepsie Town Planner were also in attendance. Mr. Tinkleman is proposing to bring a new project to the Arlington area. He referred to filling the vacant spots in the "Arlington Town Center." He is proposing a 15 year pilot project. The three individuals reviewed details about the project explaining the plans to redevelop the area. They need the school district's approval to move forward with this project. The Board Members discussed and asked questions. Ms. Zimmerman reviewed how the pilot effects the tax cap and tax levy.

Ms. Zimmerman reviewed the county's intent to run two levels of exemptions as it relates to the Veteran's tax exemption. The Board discussed and asked Ms. Zimmerman to report back on two data points.

Dr. Lyons thanked the community for passing the budget. He welcomed the Board's new Board Member, Pauline Herr. He also congratulated the employees receiving tenure and Ms. Donna Flynn-Brown, newly appointed Assistant Superintendent for Pupil Personnel Services.

**WHEREAS**, the Arlington Central School District supports the request of the property owners for the aforementioned financial assistance and tax relief,

**RESOLVED,** that the Board of Education of the Arlington Central School District ("ACSD") support the application of Build Parcel III, LLC, and Build Parcel IV, LLC, for financial assistance, including the sliding scale declining abatement Payment In Lieu of Tax ("PILOT") Agreement as described above, and it is further

**RESOLVED,** that the Superintendent of Schools or his designee be and hereby is authorized, empowered and directed to document and convey to the Dutchess County Industrial Development Agency the ACSD's support for the aforementioned application and financial assistance.

**WHEREAS**, the Arlington Central School District supports in theory the request of the property owners for the aforementioned financial assistance and tax relief, and

**WHEREAS**, the specific terms of the PILOT have yet to be determined, and

WHEREAS, the IDA has agreed to provide to the ACSD, prior to finalization of the PILOT, a copy of the PILOT and the IDA Lease Agreement with the Developers for review and to invite material comment from the ACSD on these documents,

#### **NOW THEREFORE,** it is hereby

**RESOLVED,** that the Board of Education of the Arlington Central School District ("ACSD") support the application of the Developers, for financial assistance, including the sliding scale declining abatement Payment In Lieu of Tax ("PILOT") as described above, subject to the ACSD's review and approval of the specific terms of the PILOT Agreement between the Developers and the IDA prior to the finalization of the PILOT; and

**RESOLVED,** that the Superintendent of Schools or his designee be and hereby is authorized, empowered and directed to document and convey to the Dutchess County Industrial Development Agency the ACSD's support for the aforementioned application and financial assistance as set forth in this resolution.
