# ARLINGTON CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT MINUTES OF THE BUSINESS MEETING UNION VALE MIDDLE SCHOOL NOVEMBER 8, 2016

President Steve Rossi called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm at Union Vale Middle School, 1657 E. Noxon Road, LaGrangeville, NY 12540

1) Call to Order

- 2) <u>Pledge of Allegiance</u>
- 3) <u>Roll Call</u> Board Members present were Mrs. Baxter, Dr. Eraca, Mrs. Fasulo, Mrs. Herr, Mr. McCormick, Mr. McLeod, Mr. Rossi, and Mr. Tornatore. Board Member absent was Mr. Bodnar. Also present were Dr. Lyons, Mr. Benante, Dr. DeSa, Mrs. Muenkel and Mr. Sheldon.
- 4) <u>Reading of the</u> By Mr. Rossi District Mission
- 5) <u>Approval of the</u> <u>Agenda</u> Motion by Mr. Tornatore, seconded by Mrs. Fasulo, to approve the agenda as amended to add Ms. Denise Trumpler to item 12b) vii Certified Substitutes. The motion was carried unanimously.

Motion by Mr. McLeod, seconded by Mrs. Baxter, to table items 11b) SEQRA – Overlook Property and 11c) SEQRA – Bruzgul Road, under New Business. The motion was carried unanimously.

Motion by Mrs. Baxter, seconded by Mr. McLeod, to modify the agenda with changes as indicated. The motion was carried unanimously.

Board Members discussed the solar project and had questions regarding safety protocols, the investment and savings, solar panel effects, and screening concerns. They have requested more information.

- 6) <u>Correspondence</u> Mr. McLeod received a number of e-mails from concerned citizens regarding the solar project.
- 7) <u>Public Comment</u> There were approximately 40 people in attendance. A resident thanked the District for getting the Veterans' Tax Exemption survey on the website so quickly. Several residents shared concerns regarding the solar project. A representative from

SoCore stated he would be able to clarify a lot of the questions that the Board and residents have regarding the project.

- 8) <u>Board President's</u> Mr. Rossi welcomed everyone to the meeting. He commented on a speaker's remarks questioning the integrity of the Board. Mr. Rossi cited the historical transparency and openness of the Board and if anyone had concerns to contact him. He reminded everyone that there will be a Public Hearing on November 29<sup>th</sup> regarding the Veterans' Tax Exemption.
- 9) <u>Superintendent</u> Dr. Lyons shared several "good news" items. Marching Band were the state champions this year, a tremendous accomplishment on their part. The girls' soccer team is in the state final four. The boys cross country athletes were named sectional champions. Two swimmers are going to the state meet. A lot of great news out of our athletic program. The drama production, "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum" is on November 11, 12 and 13. Dr. Lyons wished everyone a Happy Veterans' Day.

# 10) <u>Reports and Board</u> <u>Discussion Items</u>

#### <u>Union Vale Middle School Professional Learning Communities Report – Scott Wood</u>

Mr. Wood stated that the Veterans' Day celebration will be on November 10<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 am at Union Vale Middle School. He thanked the PTA for the refreshments. He presented the PLC Report. He reviewed what guides the PLC work, the goals and plans for 7<sup>th</sup> grade math, what they hope to accomplish and what steps will be taken to move forward. He also reviewed the summative and formative assessments as well as questions the students struggled with and he shared samples of students' work.

#### <u>Extern al Auditors Report, Leon ard P. Carissimo, CPA/Partner, D'A</u> <u>rcangelo & Co.,</u> <u>LLP – Kevin Sheldon</u>

Mr. Sheldon introduced Mr. Carissimo. Mr. Carissimo presented the audit review. He reviewed the three reports in the Executive Summary. The first was the Independent Auditor's Report. The District received an "unmodified opinion" rating which means there were no qualifications, it was in accordance with Government Auditing Standards (GAP), and no scope limitations. This was a fairly good report. The second report that was issued was the report on compliance with requirements for each major program and on internal control over compliance. This report identified no weaknesses. The third item was a letter that specifically addresses required communication to the Board of Education. There were no comments of concern.

Mr. Rossi commented on the audit report. The District received an unmodified opinion, which means the financial statements are accurate. It is the highest rating one can get in an audit. Also, there were no management letter comments meaning the audit firm

found all the proper financial controls in place. Mr. Sheldon and his staff have done an excellent job as this type of result is uncommon.

#### <u> Transportation Bond Followup – Kevin Sheldon</u>

Dr. Lyons stated he asked Mr. Sheldon to present a follow-up report regarding the potential Transportation Proposition to renovate the District's existing Transportation Facilities. Mr. Sheldon reviewed the monetary savings, employee time, and work space. His presentation included pictures of what the renovated space would look like. He also reviewed the recommendations.
