9) <u>Superintendent's</u> Remarks Dr. Lyons attended two Veterans' Day events at the middle schools. He stated both events had extensive student participation. Both events were truly

outstanding. He thanked all the veterans, administration and teachers.

10) Reports and Board Discussion Items

<u>Union Vale Middle School Professional Learning Communities Report –</u> Mr. Scott Wood

Mr. Scott Wood introduced Mrs. Rizzo and the 8th grade select string ensemble. The students performed for the Board Members and the audience. Mr. Wood along with several teachers gave the Professional Learning Communities report. He spoke about the Service Learning Project, its teaching and learning strategies that integrate meaningful community service with instruction and reflection adapted to the middle school level. They also spoke about HARP – Helping Arlington Reach Its Potential. 8th graders travel to elementary schools to help younger students. A video was shown where students spoke about the help that this program provides and its impact. Mr. Wood also reviewed the SMART goals, guiding principles, the focus on results and the focus on the students.

Energy Conservation Report – Mr. Jacob Lawrence

Mr. Jacob Lawrence, in his role as the Energy Education Specialist, presented the Energy Conservation Report to the Board. He reviewed the energy operating costs, the yearly energy report, summer energy savings and the student energy research project. He also reviewed the last three years of energy use. He stated to date the savings has passed the two million dollar mark. He discussed ways to raise energy wellness and achieve energy conservation.
