6) Correspondence Mr. Bodnar received an e-mail from Mr. Tesh, resident, regarding building

issues. He was happy to see some of the items updated. Mrs. Eraca received an e-mail from a taxpayer. She referred the e-mail to Dr. Lyons. The resident thanked Mrs. Eraca. Dr. Lyons was extremely approachable, pleasant, and sincere and she appreciated his time. Mr. McLeod received an e-mail from his 16 year old son's first bus driver. She was decorating her tree and remembered fondly driving his son to school as she was putting an ornament he made for her in his kindergarten year. She expressed how much she loved those little gifts.

7) <u>Public Comment</u> There was an audience of approximately 40. Several residents shared their thoughts regarding the veterans' tax exemption.

8) <u>Board President's</u> Mrs. Lappan attended the meeting in New Paltz with the Commissioner. She thought it was very good. She will be attending the meeting in Pine Plains with

Assemblywoman Didi Barrett on December 11th.

9) <u>Superintendent's</u> Remarks

Dr. Lyons suggested that the Board schedule a special meeting regarding the solar project. The Board agreed and the date is scheduled for Tuesday, December 22nd at the Central Administration Office at 7:00 pm. Dr. Lyons attended a meeting with Commissioner Elia. He stated it was a productive meeting. Ms. Elia acknowledged that mistakes were made at the state level in many different areas, but there is a focus on improving and moving forward. Dr. Lyons also stated he attended the Art Show at the high school. Great art work was displayed and he thanked the district art teachers for putting that on. He also mentioned he visited Ms. Clerkin's Kindergarten Class last week and two students stated they loved school. Dr. Lyons very much appreciated those comments.

10) Reports and Board Discussion Items

<u>Traver Road Primary School Professional Learning Communities Report – Micah Brown</u>

Mrs. Brown stated the building level leadership team participated in three days of professional development with Richard Dewey, a PLC guru with a proven track record of improving student achievement. This workshop concentrated on how to continuously improve to become a highly effective school. Mrs. Brown introduced her PLC leaders. The PLC leaders meet regularly to develop the PLC process in the building and evaluate the progress through the use of rubrics and data. Mrs. Brown reviewed the 2014-2015 progress and the action plan and goals for 2015-2016.

Veterans' Tax Exemption

The Board of Education discussed whether or not to convene another public hearing on this topic, which would be required if there were to be action taken on the Veterans' Tax Exemption. The discussion focused on changes that had occurred since the decision made in previous years not to offer the exemption because of the impact on other district taxpayers. The existence of an exemption for senior citizens was mentioned, and discussion ensued regarding the differences and similarities between the veterans' tax exemption and the current senior citizens' tax exemption. Mr. McLeod suggested placing a referendum on the May ballot to get the public's view of the veterans' exemption, given that it would result in a tax increase to non-veterans who own a home. Dr. Lyons explained that such a referendum would be non-binding, if it were to occur. It was agreed to place discussion of a non-binding referendum on a future board meeting agenda.

Motion by Peter Bodnar, seconded by Charles McLeod, to have a public hearing regarding the Veterans' Tax Exemption. The motion failed 2 - 6. Mr. Bodnar and Mr. McLeod voted yes, and Christine Baxter, Jennifer Eraca, Pauline Herr, Kelly Lappan, Edward McCormick and Steven Rossi voted no.
