**cause** (kawz) *verb* To **cause** something to happen is to be the reason that it happens.

**EXAMPLE:** Your untied shoelace might cause you to trip.

**oppose** (uh POHZ) *verb* When you **oppose** something, you take a position against it.

**EXAMPLE:** We **oppose** cutting the music program to save money.

**reaction** (ree AK shuhn) *noun* A **reaction** to something is the feeling it causes or the action taken in response.

**Example:** When Lucia read the cartoon, her reaction was to laugh.

**solution** (suh LOO shuhn) *noun* A **solution** is an answer to a problem. **EXAMPLE:** Once I figured it out, the **solution** to the puzzle seemed simple.

**violence** (VY luhns) *noun* **Violence** is the use of physical force to harm someone or to damage property.

**EXAMPLE:** The violence of the crowd resulted in broken store windows.
