Habitats How Habitats Affect Us

Humans have certain features that explain why we live in our habitats. We have lungs instead of gills and legs instead of fins. Therefore, we live on land rather than in the sea. Some species of rabbits are small and brown. They eat grass. Therefore they are live in the woods rather than the arctic.

There are many things that make a habitat perfect for an animal. Animals live in places where they can get food. They live in places where they blend in with the environment around them. They live in places that are not too hot or too cold for them. The rain forest would be too hot for a penguin. The rain forest is perfect for leopards. The arctic would be too cold for crocodiles. It is perfect for polar bears.

Scientists believe that animals have **adapted**¹ to their environments. Camels live in the desert. They are able to live in the desert because they can go for long periods of time without water. Other animals would die in the desert. Camels have adapted to survive there.
