What is a Title I school?

A Title I school is a school that receives supplemental federal funding due to our economic circumstances. Title I funding is intended to help close the achievement gap between low and high performing schools and ensure that all children have the opportunity to obtain a high quality education and reach grade-level proficiency.

What are Title I school requirements?

- Hold an annual Title I meeting to explain Overlook's policy and program.
- Inform parents of their child's progress.
 - Common Core Standards
 - Overlook Primary School Assessments
 - Reading - Fountas and Pinnell Language Arts Assessments and Teacher Assessments
 - Math – Arlington's Diagnostic Assessments and Teacher Assessments
- Meet with parents to make decisions about Title I programs, ways to involve parents in these programs and create a school-parent compact.

What can Title I funds be used for?

Provide before or after school or summer programs.

Train parents, teachers and other school staff.

Buy equipment and materials.

Support parent involvement activities.

Hire additional teachers, assistants and specialists.
